# Wood Technics Tips

## Prepared Learner

Prepared Learner classes are designed to get students ready for a variety of college-level academics, including reading, writing, math and science. Scores on the COMPASS® or ACT assessments will tell us if you need to take one or more areas of these classes, which may be required for some Gen Ed classes. Students must successfully complete each required Prepared Learner class with a C grade or better before registering for some General Education courses.

## Early Start - 410-303 Construction Safety

All students are required to successfully complete this two-week course, in August, prior to other fall semester program courses.

## Pre-program Status Students

A pre-program status student has been accepted into a program and is taking courses before actual entry into the major core courses because the major core courses are filled to capacity or because the student wishes to begin with General Studies courses (listed in the box) before entry into the major core courses.

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## Pre-program Status Considerations

- You must estimate how long you will need to wait before beginning your program core courses. As this cannot be predicted exactly, you must make your best guess as you plan which courses to finish before you begin program core courses.
- Federal financial aid requirements say that students must complete their programs by the time 150% of the published credits have been attempted.

## Transferability

For the potential to transfer to a 4-year postsecondary school:

- Take 809-199 Psychology of Human Relations rather than 809-351 Occupational Relations

## Tool Set Purchase

You will be required to purchase an approved tool set through CVTC that costs approximately \$800. These tools will be used throughout the program.

## First Aid-CPR Certification

The level of CPR must be at the **American Heart Association – Healthcare Provider** level or the **American Red Cross – Professional Rescuer** level and be current to be counted for graduation. First Aid certification must also be current for graduation.
