**Course:** Automotive Maintenance Technician Exploratory  
**Course Number:** 602-102-501  
**Description:** Students will learn and perform basic vehicle maintenance procedures, including oil changes, tire mount & balance, brake inspections, belt and hose inspection, and perform an overall vehicle safety inspection. Course work will continue with basic electrical theory as it relates to an automobile. Careers and opportunities in the automotive field will also be discussed.

**Course:** Explore Auto Body Repair & Refinish

This class will expose you to modern law enforcement as practices in the United States. Foundations of modern law enforcement, issues of ethics, police officer certification, jurisdictions and police authority will be discussed.
