Course: Automotive Maintenance Technician Exploratory

Cost: \$124.83

Description: Students will learn and perform basic vehicle maintenance procedures, including oil changes, tire mount & balance, brake inspections, belt and hose inspection, and perform an overall vehicle safety inspection. Course work will continue with basic electrical theory as it relates to an automobile. Careers and opportunities in the automotive field will also be discussed.

Course: Explore Auto Body Repair & Refinish
